	Research tells us that increasing access to alcohol tends to increase the level of alcohol problems within a community, and we know that alcohol misuse has a direct link to crime and disorder, public nuisance, poor health and harm to children and young people. (References to relevant literature can be provided if required.) NHS Shetland therefore objects to the extension of off sales hours.
	However we recognise that it might seem unfair to prevent Ollaberry Community Enterprises from extending their off sales hours if other off sales premises in the area (e.g. Brae Co-op) do not have similar restrictions, and therefore consider that there might be an argument for looking at availability of alcohol within a whole locality (e.g. North Mainland) before making a decision.
	Whether the application is accepted or not, we ask that a condition of awarding a premises licence is that staff clearly understand how to recognise problem drinking, and know where to direct customers for help and support if required. NHS Shetland can provide small cards and information which we suggest should be clearly displayed in any premises that sell alcohol and can support staff with training if necessary.

In addition, data from Alcohol Focus Scotland shows that although the Island Councils (Eilean Siar, Orkney and Shetland) have a lower level of outlet density than Scotland as a whole, there are pockets of high alcohol provision, of which Lerwick is the highest of all, by a significant measure. The Islands Councils all have higher levels of alcohol-related harm than the rest of Scotland. (There were a total of 187 alcohol-related offences recorded in 2014 – 15, and 573 admissions to Accident and Emergency during the same period)

can be provided if required.) We therefore **object** to increasing the alcohol display area.

Research also suggests that the relationships between alcohol outlet density and harm was stronger for off-sales outlets than for on-sales. This supports claims that off-sales outlets have the greatest potential for alcohol-related harm, due to their cheaper product, large volumes obtainable, accessibility for under-age drinkers, and the absence of control over the final recipient (Forsyth and Davidson 2010).

Whether the application is accepted or not, we ask that a condition of awarding a premises licence is that staff clearly understand how to recognise problem drinking (as distinct from drunkenness), and know where to direct customers for help and support if required. NHS Shetland can provide small cards and information which we suggest should be clearly displayed in any premises that sell alcohol.
