- c) The application would be inconsistent with all of the following Licensing Objectives:
- 1. Preventing crime and disorder
- 2. Securing public safety
- 3. Preventing public nuisance
- 4. Protecting and improving public health
- 5. Protecting children from harm

Shetland has a problem with over consumption of alcohol. In line with the fourth licensing objective, "protecting and improving public health", we support moves that make it less likely that people will routinely drink alcohol. The current situation with having alcohol in a separate building is more in line with countries which have a healthier relationship with alcohol. The proposed move of the sale of alcohol from a separate building to within the main grocery store, increases accessibility and visibility of alcohol; which we know, in turn, increases consumption. Therefore, it is not clear how this application fulfils the fourth licensing objective in particular. We would welcome information on how this licensing objective will be fulfilled under the application.

Whether the application is accepted or not, we ask that a condition of awarding a premises licence is that staff clearly understand how to recognise problem drinking, and know where to direct customers for help and support if required. NHS Shetland can provide small cards and information which we suggest should be clearly displayed in any premises that sell alcohol.
