	The Coach House Theatre Conservation Project	Alman Dramatic Club will conserve its club house and theatre, a circa 1901 B-listed former Coach House, thanks to a £35,000 grant. The grant will help the community pay for the necessary repair works to provide a revitalised heritage and community asset, as well as enabling the secure store, and recording, of the costume archive. 	Histshorey Project	A group of young people in Dundee will explore the heritage of the outstanding A-listed building The Shore and surrounding docklands, with help from heritage partners and a £24,900 Young Roots grant. The group, part of a Dundee Council organisation to assist young people's personal development, will gain insight into cataloguing, conservation, archiving and experience behind-the-scenes tours of the museum collections. Their research will be interpreted through photographs, a new time-capsule, education pack, stories, drawings, and audio recordings. Priority Area	Our Wee School's a Good Wee School	Carstairs Junction Primary School, built in 1902, will use a grant of £21,200 to celebrate the school's heritage before its scheduled demolition. The school has been a primary and secondary school and was a Polish Military Training Centre during World War II. Students will work with the broader community and Polish ex-servicemen to produce a DVD and booklet, conserving the school's interesting history, artefacts and memories.
