The introduction to the seminar will be on Scottish Resilience and the different streams that lead to that by Jane Askew of the Civil Contingencies Unit, Scottish Government.

Military Aid to the Civil Community, a response to a civil emergency as a result of a natural disaster or major incident. Lieutenant Colonel John Kelly will inform on this and how it can assist the Shetland community.

The opening of Terminal 5 at Heathrow created headlines across the world and caused major disruption to thousands of passengers. Charlie Maclean-Bristol of PlanB Consulting Ltd. will look at what went wrong and set out the lessons learned from the opening so that those who are responsible for similar high profile events can avoid having a similar experience.

People often need to be “re-homed” following an emergency, sometimes for long periods of time, which creates new “communities” with a whole range of issues. Lucy Easthope, a Disaster Management Researcher has focused on community recovery and care of survivors, the bereaved and the deceased after disaster and will talk on these issues.

This talk will focus on how BCM in BT has grown from being a paper based approach to a cutting edge software tool and will be delivered by Dean Beaumont, Head of Business Continuity for BT

A project which is part of the Northern Periphery Programme on the co-operation for safety in sparsely populated areas - CoSafe will be the subject of the talk by Professor Andrew Sim and Tom Laverty of the Western Isles NHS Board. The project aims to increase the preparedness for major accidents and extreme situations in rural areas and to develop emergency medical care in extreme conditions.
