Any objection or representation must be in writing, must specify the ground of the objection or the nature of the representation, must specify the name and address of the person making it, must be signed by him or on his behalf.

Such an objection or representation shall be considered to have been made within the period referred to if it is delivered by hand within that period or posted (by registered or recorded delivery post) so that in the normal course of post it might be expected to be delivered within that period.

It should also be noted that where an objection or representation is made to the Council after the date referred to but before a final decision is taken on the application, it is competent for the Council to entertain it if satisfied that there is sufficient reason why the objection or representation was not made within the period of time stated.

* The date should be the twenty-first day after the latest of the following:-

- (a) the date of publication by the Council of a notice in a newspaper of the application where the form of licence falls within a prescribed class;
- (b) the date (if any), specified by the Council; or
- (c) the date the application was submitted to the Council.

The Site Notice must be displayed for the whole of the period of Twenty-one days at or near the premises so that it can be conveniently read by the public.
