D & G Leslie, Esplanade, off sales = 73 yards away.

Lounge Bar, Mounthooly St, on sales = 94 yards away.

Montys Bistro, Mounthooly St, on sales = 100 yards away.

Grand Hotel, Commercial St, on sales = 34 yards away.

Captain Flints, Esplanade, on sales = 73 yards away.

Da Noost, Commerciel St = 24 yards away.

Thule Bar, Esplanade, = 118 yards away.

Queens Hotel, Commercial St, = 253 yards away.

Masonic Club, Queens Lane, =193 yards away.

Currently at weekends we have a lot of broken glass, empty cans, bottles and other litter strewn around Commercial Street as a result of the establishments within the area, this mess is also impacting upon the lanes.

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The close proximity of these establishments cause a public nuisance due the large crowds congregating on the street with their loud and often violent behaviour dispersing up the lanes, as a result of this there is an impact on those who live in and around the lanes area of Lerwick.

I believe that another off sales outlet would be of further detriment to the area increasing

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public nuisance, crime and disorder and encouraging further over-use of alcohol within Shetland.

As evidenced above, there is already an over provision of off sales and licened premises of a similar nature in the immediate vicinity of the proposed off sales. In addition, we also have occasional licensed events within the vicinity such as the Johnsmas foy and Food Festival.

Granting this application will contribute further to over provision of licensed premises of this nature in the vicinity as well as contributing to an increase in crime, disorder and public nuisance.

If the Licensing board grant this application then opening times should be resricted to 10:00 hours until 18:00 hours so as to help minimise further public nuisance, crime and disorder which would increase or be exacerbated granting.

Over the years Shetland seems to have adopted an almost siamese twin who we all know as alcohol, this twin has and will continue to cause nothing but ill fate for Shetland and those who fall within its grasp. You have a responsability and a public duty to look at this and every application and this should and could be a very good chance for you to exercise that duty by NOT granting this application. I have heard in the past that the council would like most of if not all commercial premises occupied on Commercial Street, this I can well understand. However if we beleive what we see in our local press and hear on BBC radio Shetland on a weekly basis then we must understand what alcohol is doing to our community and what damage it is causing. If anything the licencing board should be trying to minimize the amount of alcohol outlets in Lerwick .

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I hope that you take the time to read this and find within yourselves the strenth to do the right thing.
