## **NOTES**

- 1. No person may keep a boarding establishment for animals (the term animal is defined as meaning any dog or cat) unless he obtains a licence from the Local Authority on payment of a fee of £191. The applicant may also be liable for a Vet Inspection fee should that be deemed necessary. Fees are correct as of 1st April 2023.
- 2. In deciding whether to grant a licence, the Local Authority is required to have regard to the need for securing that there will be provided accommodation suitable as respects construction, size of quarters, number of occupants, exercising facilities, temperature, lighting, ventilation and cleanliness: that there will be an adequate supply of suitable food, drink and bedding material and the animals will be adequately exercised, that all reasonable precautions will be taken to prevent and control the spread of infectious of contagious diseases, that appropriate steps for the protection of the animals will be taken in the case of fire or other emergency; and that a register will be recorded, with the date of their arrival and departure and the name and address of the owner.
- 3. The Local Authority may authorise in writing any of its Officers or a Veterinary Practitioner to inspect any premises in respect of which a licence had been granted.
