They will keep an eye on that bin and if it does overflow then they can look to add one back, but they are hoping it should be enough to cover that area.

- 13.1** The clerk updated members on the final financial position for 24/25.
- 13.2** We have successfully secured the Core funding £14643.71 from Shetland Island Council. All paperwork signed by Mr A Cooper and returned to Mr M Duncan. Funds have been paid in on 29<sup>th</sup> May 2025.
- 13.3** Information Commissioner Invoice £52.00. This is an increase of £12.00 from 24/25. Payment Approved. **Clerk to progress.**

**2025/05/14 CORRESPONDENCE**

- 14.1 SCBF Advance Grant Scheme - CGS0037-01 - CGS Tier 2 Application - Voe & District Agricultural Society Ltd** – The Voe Show want to replace cattle gates for show field to ensure animals are secure and public is safe on show day. Event is on 1st Saturday in August every year and people from the whole of Shetland and tourists all attend. Current gates are very old and people want to see cattle at the show but need to be able to do so safely. Total cost of project £7,094.40. They are applying to three Community Councils, Delting, Nesting and Lunnasting and Northmaven. They are applying for £2,364.00 from Delting Community Council SCBF. Members agreed unanimously to award the full grant amount of £2364.00. **Clerk to progress.**
- 14.2 SCBF Advance Grant Scheme - CGS0039-01 - CGS Tier 2 Application – Delting Dolphins ACSC** - The project is to gain new equipment for the club to help swimmers gain their full potential in the water, this equipment will help coaches analyse the swimmers more efficiently and provide much more detailed feedback for quicker improvement in technique from the swimmers. The equipment being asked for are, an underwater camera system, an ipad pro, a laptop, analysing software, stopwatches, backstroke ledges, heart rate monitors, lap card counter and rebranding of the club kit. This will benefit anyone who is wanting to improve their swimming technique in the North Mainland of Shetland as they can come by club sessions to gain full access to our coaches and equipment. The club is made up of 25 swimmers which currently 20 from Delting, 3 are from Northmavine area and 2 are from Nesting and Lunnasting area. They are applying to Delting (80%), Nesting and Lunnasting (8%) and Northmaven (12%) Community Councils. Total cost of project £19120.43. Total applied for from three Community Councils £17120.43. They are applying for £13696.34 from Delting Community Council SCBF. Following discussion, the members agreed unanimously to award the grant amount of £3023.55 which is 80% of the breakdown cost for the following items - for stopwatches, backstroke ledges, heart rate monitors, lap card counter and rebranding of the club kit. The view of members was that the other items would be better acquired for a wider Shetland usage. **Clerk to progress.**
- 14.3 Grant Application Form – Mossbank Primary School** – Mossbank Primary School are applying for funding for three school trips. Bus hire P1-P7 School trip to Mousa and airport on 10<sup>th</sup> June 2025 (£395.00) Bus hire P5-P7 to take part in the Scottish Opera Show at Brae on 17<sup>th</sup> June 2025 (£150.00) and Bus hire for nursery trip to Clickimin Broch, Fire station and Northlink on 27<sup>th</sup> May 2025 (320.00). Total cost of project £865.00. They are applying for £665.00. The chairman asked for the Mossbank School to be made aware that they need to submit an application well in advance of the project. Members agreed unanimously to award the full grant amount of £665.00. **Clerk to progress.**
- 14.4 Burial Ground Capacity** – Ms Y Scott emailed with the following response - I would like to draw your attention to section 3(1)(a) and (b) of the Burial and Cremation Act (Scotland) 2016, <https://www.legislation.gov.uk/asp/2016/20/section/3> which outlines the duty of each local authority to provide at least one burial ground within its area, and the discretionary power to provide additional burial grounds as needed.  
For further details on how this is implemented locally please refer to our Burial ground Management Report and Policy, available here <https://coins.shetland.gov.uk/viewDoc.asp?c=e%97%9Df%96py%8D> approved by the

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Environment and Transport Committee last year, in particular Appendix 1a, 3.1 Burial Ground Provision which explains the current approach: Burial grounds will not be extended unless there is no other alternative burial ground within the community area. Where additional provision is required the relevant community council will be consulted to identify a preferred burial ground for extension or to assist in selecting a suitable site for a new one.

Be assured that individuals may still be laid to rest in burial grounds where pre-purchase of Exclusive Rights of Burial (EROB) is not available, provided a lair is available at the time of need. In situations where no lairs are available for full coffin interments, a lair transfer may be arranged, allowing for the interment of ashes within an existing lair. In other words, even when space for future coffin burials is no longer available, there is typically still the opportunity for ashes interments in those lairs. Alternatively, a different burial ground may be chosen for a coffin burial. Looking ahead, within the Burial and Cremation (Scotland) Act, section 32 <https://www.legislation.gov.uk/asp/2016/20/part/1/crossheading/lair-restoration-to-use> introduces the framework for future regulations on the re-use of lairs. Subject to public consultation, lairs may be reused 100 years after the last burial. This may involve a "lift and deepen" process, where existing remains are respectfully retained within the same lair to allow space for a new coffin interment. (If an objection was received, reuse of the lair would be paused for 10 years, then the process would begin again).

- 14.5 Feasibility Study for Redevelopment of Sail Loft, Lower Voe** - Voe Community Development Association (SCIO) was recently awarded funding by the Scottish Land Fund and the Architectural Heritage Fund towards the cost of a feasibility study, including a business plan, to explore the potential for redevelopment of the Sail Loft at Lower Voe.

Following a competitive tendering process, PJP Architects LLP have been appointed and the work has just commenced. If the feasibility study concludes that it could be a viable project VCDA will then apply to the Scottish Land Fund and other sources to try to obtain the necessary funding to firstly acquire the building, then if successful make further applications for development funding.

Shetland Amenity Trust (who currently own the building) has agreed to put the sale of the building on hold until the end of this year to enable VCDA to carry out the feasibility study and then obtain the funding required for acquisition.

VCDA and/ or PJP Architects LLP will consult DCC as part of the feasibility study process, and further updates will be provided as the work progresses, but please feel free to contact me anytime if you require any information regarding this project. - 14.7 SSE Renewables Viking Wind Farm: Plans to submit "stopping up" order for the old Sandwater Road** - SSE Renewable's plans to submit a "stopping up" order for the old Sandwater Road. As part of the development of the Viking wind farm, they have provided a new Sandwater Road for Shetland Islands Council in accordance with their planning permission. This new section of road is due to replace part of the existing B9075 Sandwater public road, upgrading it from a B road to an A road and making it much safer for public use. To meet the requirements of their planning permission, SSE Renewables will shortly be submitting a request to Shetland Islands Council to 'Stop Up' the old section of the B9075 which has been replaced by the new section of road. If approved, the order will close the road to public vehicular traffic, and the old road will become a recreational route for walking, wheeling, cycling and equestrian use. A permanent car park is planned near the older section of the Sandwater Road (located at the junction of the A970, between the old B9075 and the new section of road) which is also required to be delivered by SSE Renewables through their planning conditions. Work on a permanent Sandwater road carpark is anticipated to begin later this month, and will allow safe and convenient parking for commuters and those wishing to access the wind farm recreationally under outdoor access rules

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once all construction activities complete on site. A bus layby and bus stop is also being installed in this location and their principal contractor has begun installing pedestrian signage which links the B9075 to Kergord and Mid Kames. While the old section of road will be closed for public vehicular access under the stopping up order, it should be noted that vehicular access to the old section of road will be maintained for landowners, crofters and utilities. The stopping up order will be formally advertised in local press by Shetland Islands Council in due course once this has been submitted by SSE Renewables. They are also pleased to confirm that a further permanent carpark at the North section of the wind farm site, in addition to the Sandwater Road car park mentioned above, was also recently approved by Shetland Islands Council. The development, which will include a picnic area and secure storage locker (for storage of Ability Shetland's all terrain wheelchairs and adapted e-bikes), will offer further accessibility for local visitors wanting to utilise trails around the Wind Farm once all construction work on site completes. Work on the North carpark is expected to begin once pre-commencement conditions are satisfied with Shetland Islands Council and they will continue to share updates as this work progresses. In the meantime, while final construction activities take place on site, public access restrictions remain in place to protect the safety of the public and their staff while this work is ongoing. They would like to thank the local community for their patience during this time and will confirm when this work is completed. Members were happy to note the content but pointed out the road is actually not in our district.

**The Clerk shared email with Delting Community Council members.** Members discussed the issue of the closure of Dales Lees and the lack of information or consultation regarding the effect on traffic from Toft and Mossbank. When SSE distribution had the public meeting in November there was nothing mentioned about closing the road for two months. As Mr N Hutcheson was involved in the process he should have made the Community Council and the community aware how they were going to be affected. Members requested SSE Distribution to be emailed to ask if it was possible to either carry out the works in the winter months or carry out works though the day and night meaning the road would only be closed for half the time. Members requested Mr N Hutcheson be emailed regarding the lack of information regarding the road closure as there will be a significant increase in traffic through Brae. The members want extra better signage to be put in Brae and Voe with the addition of smiley faces in both places. If there is a cost involved then maybe SSE Distribution can help with the costs. **Clerk to progress.**

Information for community council's guidelines cover everything it needs to. Members think the information we receive about an application is adequate. Members had no further comments on the survey.

**14.11 Have Your Say: Exploring a District Heating Scheme in Brae** – Mr Phil Stanier and Mr Mark Gitsham are getting in touch on behalf of Shetland Islands Council to let us know about early proposals for a potential district heating scheme covering much of Brae. The idea is to provide cleaner, more affordable heat for homes and community buildings through a shared energy system. This project is still at a very early stage. Right now, they are exploring whether a district heating scheme could work for this part of Brae—and listening to what local people think is a key part of that process. If there is enough community interest, it could lead to lower heating costs, warmer homes, and a more sustainable energy future for our area. **15.3 Community Led Local Development – Launch** - The Shetland Community Led Local Development (CLLD) programme for 2025/26 is now open to consider applications from Shetland based social enterprises, community development companies and constituted not for profit voluntary organisations, to apply for project funding in the current financial year. The Shetland CLLD programme is financed by the Scottish Government. Shetland Islands Council, is administering the programme on behalf of the LAG and is now inviting enquiries from community-led organisations to apply for grant support. ### 15.4 **New funding announced: CashBack for Communities** - A new phase has been announced for the Scottish Government's CashBack for Communities programme, with a significant increase in funding available.

The programme will strengthen communities across Scotland by supporting young people at risk of involvement in antisocial behaviour, offending or reoffending. The funding, which reinvests criminal assets recovered through the Proceeds of Crime Act, will provide the opportunities and the tools to support young people to make informed decisions about their future.

Funding will **open to applications from Thursday 12 June** and will provide up to £26 million from April 2026 to end of March 2029.

### 15.5 **Scottish & Southern Electricity - Powering Communities to Net Zero fund** - The Powering Communities to Net Zero fund has recently reopened with two funding strands: Low Carbon Technology Fund and Physical and Environmental Resilience Fund.

The fund has a total value of £3m and runs annually, concluding in Spring 2028. Deadline for applications is 25th June 2025 and an eligible area in this bidding round is the North of Scotland distribution network.

The **Low Carbon Technology Fund** can be used for: Solar Panels, Heat Systems, Battery storage, Renewable energy generation, Smart Heating Controls, Energy Efficiency Measures, Electric Vehicle Charging. This fund is a minimum of £1,000 to a maximum of £20,000.

The **Physical and Environmental Resilience Fund** can be used for: Projects that enhance community facilities, services, and communication to mitigate the impact of, or support the local response to a significant emergency such as extended loss of power or severe weather events or climate change. This fund is a minimum of £1,000 to a maximum of £15,000.

### 15.6 **Bright Start Breakfasts** - The Bright Start Breakfasts Fund is now open for applications. As announced in this year's [Programme for Government](#), Bright Start Breakfasts funding will expand access to breakfast clubs for primary school children over the 25/26 academic year.

Funding will be prioritised to areas where access to a breakfast club is most needed, and will expand access to families who are on the lowest incomes, or most at risk of living in poverty. It will enable existing breakfast clubs to expand their provision, as well as support the establishment of new breakfast clubs where needed.

## 2025/05/16 ANY OTHER COMPETENT BUSINESS

**16.1 Safety Muckle Roe Road** – Ms J Johnson, Resident Muckle Roe emailed to follow up to concerns she has on the safety on the Muckle Roe Road. She hoped Neil Hutcheson could give some suggestions that could help. Simple keep left arrows or "Slow" on the worst blind spots could be a great help. The road continues to be busy all year round with varying degrees of problems and if some simple measures could help it would be very welcome. One of the worst parts of the road is just south of the Muckle Roe Hall. They are not asking for anything major, she would like something to be done as soon as the chipping is complete in the summer. Members asked for Mr J Duncan to be emailed to conduct an initial survey to see what of the points raised can be easily achieved and what may take time. **Clerk to progress.**
