

Mobile Phones in Shetland Schools – Teacher/Instructor Survey

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Executive Summary

Mobile Phone Usage in Schools

Primary vs. Secondary: There is a strong consensus that mobile phone policies should differ between primary and secondary schools. Primary pupils generally should not have phones, while secondary pupils might need them for specific purposes.

Communication with Parents: Many respondents believe that communication between parents and pupils should go through the school office rather than directly via mobile phones during school hours to avoid disruptions and ensure safety.

Educational Use: Some teachers find mobile phones useful for educational purposes, such as accessing online resources, conducting quizzes, or using educational apps. However, there is concern about the lack of sufficient IT resources in schools, which places greater reliance on mobile phones.

Disruptions and Distractions

Classroom Disruptions: Mobile phones are seen as a source of distraction in classrooms. Teachers report frequent disruptions due to pupils using phones during lessons.

Social Skills and Interaction: There is concern that mobile phone use during breaks and lunchtimes reduces face-to-face social interactions among pupils, impacting their social skills development.

Policy Enforcement and Challenges:

Enforcement: Teachers rarely needed support from colleagues to deal with mobile phone related distractions, however, a few pupils have resisted handing over phones. There are inconsistencies in policy implementation across schools.

Parental Support: Effective enforcement of mobile phone policies requires support from parents. Some respondents suggest that parents need to be more involved in ensuring their children follow school rules regarding phone use.

Health and Safety Concerns:

Mental Health: There are concerns about the negative impact of mobile phone use on pupils' mental health, including issues related to cyberbullying and exposure to inappropriate content.

Physical Safety: The potential for unauthorized photography and video recording raises privacy and safety concerns. Some teachers suggest banning phones altogether to mitigate these risks.

Recommendations arising from Teacher/Instructor responses

Differentiated policies: Implement different mobile phone policies for primary and secondary schools, considering the specific needs and maturity levels of pupils.

Enhanced IT Resources: Invest in more IT resources, such as laptops and tablets, to reduce reliance on mobile phones for educational purposes.

Clear Communication Channels: Ensure that all communication between parents and pupils during school hours goes through the school office.

Consistent Enforcement: Develop clear, consistent policies for mobile phone use and ensure they are enforced uniformly across all schools.

Parental Involvement: Engage parents in discussions about mobile phone policies and seek their support in enforcing rules.

Health and Safety Measures: Address mental health and safety concerns by limiting mobile phone use and educating pupils about responsible phone use.

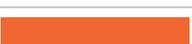
