#### What is a Local Place Plan?

A Local Place Plan (LPP) is a community-led vision for how **land and buildings** should be **developed, used, and conserved**. It helps shape planning decisions and gives your community a stronger voice.

#### Why these topics?

Each topic reflects a key aspect of community life that can be influenced through land use and planning. Together, they support a thriving, inclusive, and resilient place.

### Why link to planning policy?

Local Place Plans (LPPs) influence statutory planning decisions. Aligning your community's ideas with existing policy strengthens your voice and ensures proposals are realistic and deliverable.

---

### Key Policy Frameworks

#### Shetland Local Development Plan (LDP) 2014

Adopted September 2014, sets out spatial strategy and policies for sustainable development. Includes General Policies (GP1–GP3), Natural Heritage (NH1–NH7), Historic Environment (HE1–HE4), and topic-specific policies on housing, energy, transport, and more.

#### National Planning Framework 4 (NPF4)

Came into force February 2023. Part of the statutory development plan. Includes 33 national policies grouped under **Sustainable Places**, **Liveable Places**, and **Productive Places**. Key themes: climate and nature crises, net zero, biodiversity, housing, transport, energy, digital infrastructure, and community wealth building.

#### The Shetland Partnership Plan (2018–2028)

Local Outcomes Improvement Plan under the Community Empowerment (Scotland) Act 2015. Shared priorities: **Participation**, **People**, **Place**, **Money**. Focus on reducing inequality and improving wellbeing.

### Links to Shetland Partnership Plan

- **Participation:** Engage communities in shaping LPP proposals
  - **People:** Address health, education, and equality outcomes
  - **Place:** Support attractive, sustainable settlements
  - **Money:** Promote affordable housing and local economic resilience
