



Shetland Islands Council wants to know how to make learning support better for children and young people. They are asking parents, carers, children and young people to share their thoughts. This is called the Support for Learning Review.



There are more children needing learning support now. The Council wants to know what is working well and what can be improved. This will help make learning better for everyone in Shetland.



Support for Learning means helping all children join in school and do well. This can be through special teachers, helpers, or working with health and social services. Support can change as children grow.



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You can help by filling out a survey, going to a drop-in event, or having an individual meeting. You can also share your story in a case study. This will help the Council understand your experiences.



The Council is working with Ability Shetland to make sure everyone can join in. They want to hear from as many people as possible to make learning support better.



Drop-in events will be held across Shetland. They are a chance to share your thoughts on learning support. There will be a free childcare provided by Ability Shetland for families who need it.



Events are open to all families, even if you do not use Ability Shetland services. You can attend for as long as you like and share feedback in different ways.



Drop-in sessions will be held in places like Unst, Yell, Aith, and Lerwick. There is also an online session for people on smaller islands. Dates and times are listed for each location in another document



If you need help to join in or need information in a different way, you can ask for support. The Council wants everyone to be able to take part.
