Financial advice and support

Scottish Welfare Fund – Crisis Grant

People on low incomes may be able to get a grant from the Scottish Welfare Fund in the event of a crisis. This is a one-off payment to help people cope during an emergency or disaster, or due to unexpected expenses. Crisis grants may be given as cash or vouchers, e.g. to buy food or fuel. These are available through the Council, by completing the online application form (or have an advisor complete it with you), or printing a paper copy. Contact by phone: 01595 744682.

Working Age Benefits, including Universal Credit

- Benefit checks and advice Contact Shetland Islands Citizen's Advice Bureau (CAB) for a benefit check and advice on the best option for you. Local CAB advisors can check which benefits people are entitled to and whether they are receiving their full entitlement, and can support people to make a claim. They are also able to support people to challenge benefit decisions. CAB provides free advice and assistance to people in Shetland. CAB is not offering face-to-face advice but are continuing to provide advice and support to folk across the isles by phone and by email. Contact: 01595 694696 or sicab@shetland.org
- If a person has recently stopped work, they might be entitled to benefits based on their National Insurance contributions. These are non-means-tested.
- If already claiming benefits (i.e. income-related ESA, Income Support, income-based JSA, Tax Credits or Housing Benefit), a person should seek advice from Shetland's CAB before making any further benefit claims.
- Low income or out of work People of working age can apply for Universal Credit if they are on a low income or are out of work. A partner's income and savings is also taken into account. Most applications are made online, but assistance can be provided. - Advance payment It is possible to apply for an advance to the first estimated payment, finding out if this is successful on the same day as applying. These must be paid back, with the money being taken from future benefit payments (i.e. it is a loan): https://www.gov.uk/universal-credit/get-an-advance-first-payment

Pension Credit

Pensioners on low incomes can apply for Pension Credit to top up their weekly income. More information, including how to apply, is available from: https://www.gov.uk/pension-credit

Best Start Grant and Best Start Foods

This is provided locally by Shetland's CAB, such as providing support to reduce outgoings to creditors and consolidate and manage repayments for all types of debt.

Free School Meal Entitlements and School Clothing Grants

Families on a low income can get help towards school clothing, and a school lunch, free of charge. All P1 to P3s receive free school meals, and meals for nursery children will be free from August. Since school closures began, as a result of COVID-19, those families eligible for Free School Meals and/or School Clothing grants, are receiving £3.00 per day per child during School Holidays, to assist families to purchase food.

Energy advice and support

Energy Advice Service

Shetland's CAB runs an Energy Advice Service, which aims to support households to reduce bills, and/or improve the warmth of the home. Contact: 01595 694696 or sicab@shetland.org

Home Energy Scotland

Advisors can help with questions people may have, including the latest information from energy suppliers who have agreed emergency measures to make sure vulnerable people and those with prepayment meters do not get cut off. Call free on 0808 808 2282, Monday to Friday 8am - 8pm; and Saturday 9am - 5pm.

SSE Electricity Key

Those with an SSE Electricity Key, experiencing a lack of income, can arrange a discretionary credit, with the customer paying back £5 per week. If they are shielding or isolating, and needing to put more cash on it, they can phone the Paygo number on 03450729495 (this may be charged at local rate, depending on provider, and they are experiencing high call volumes, with reduced staff). There are two options: if an engineer is close by they can collect key the key and top it up, or the person can make payment over the phone and a key will be posted to them.

Housing costs

Paying Rent

Any person experiencing difficulty in paying their rent should contact their landlord as soon as possible, to discuss. Useful contacts are: Shetland Islands Council 01595 744682; and Hjaltland Housing Association 01595 694986.

Mortgage Arrears and Breaks

If a household is struggling to pay their mortgage, they should contact their mortgage provider as they are being encouraged to offer support to those who need it, based on each individual customer's circumstances. If you have any concerns, speak to CAB.

Housing Benefit/Housing Element in UC and Council Tax Reduction

These home-related benefits can be applied for when household income is low. Housing benefit (or Housing Element in Universal Credit claim) can help pay for rent, and Council Tax Reduction applies a discount to the Council Tax bill of a household: <u>https://www.shetland.gov.uk/about_benefits/HowCanIClaim.asp or phone</u> 01595 732053.

Other

Access to Sanitary Products

The Council provides access to free sanitary products for those who can't afford or can't access products. Products can be supplied directly to individuals or through community groups or public buildings. More information is available from <u>anna.sutherland@shetland.gov.uk</u>, 01595 744510.

Free period products are also available to all young people attending school. Pupils can complete an order form to sign up to a 3 monthly subscription or for a trial one-off 3 month supply. Early Help – Clothing Assistance
