Development Committee:

Achievements also included:

- The transfer of the old school, South Nesting is an exemplar community asset transfer project from both a community and Council perspective.
- Work is progressing with 7N Architects and Architecture and Design Scotland, to develop the Knab Site Masterplan for the site, which will be presented to Committee in February 2019.
- Scalloway Making Places Project is achieving very good community engagement. This will help to establish the community priorities, and how these can be achieved.
- The Economic Development Strategy 2018-22 and action plan was adopted in August 2018.

Shetland College Board:

Achievements also included:

- Education Scotland: How Good is our College –
 Evaluation Report: 91.7% of students also report
 that they are satisfied with their overall college
 experience and 72.7% of students reporting that
 their time at college has helped them to develop
 knowledge and skills for the workplace.
- Train Shetland have added Furniture Making to their Modern Apprenticeships and have also seen Hairdressing being approved by SQA and delivered by Shetland College, which has meant that apprentices no longer have to travel to Perth.

Harbour Board:

Achievements also included:

- The Council awarded the contract for Scalloway's new fish market, with work due to start on site in December 2018.
- A successful ship-to-ship transfer of crude oil took place in September at the Port of Sullom Voe, the first such transfer since December 2015.

Education and Families Committee:

Achievements also included:

- From July to September, Shetland Library ran 57
 events in the Lerwick Library, including Big Takeover
 sessions, which 1,005 people attended. This is the
 Library's highest ever number of events for this
 quarter.
- In Q2, the attendance rate for primary school pupils was 96.9% (against a target of 95.1%). For secondary school pupils it was 94.3% (against a target of 91.9%). Yearly government figures continually show Shetland to be performing above the national average.
- The Happyhansel Primary School Nursery was inspected by the Care Inspectorate in September 2018. The school achieved a grade of 'good' for the quality of care and support it provides and the quality of management and leadership.
- The Care Inspectorate also inspected our Adoption Service, Fostering Service, Children's Residential Services at Grodians, and Islesburgh Out of School Care Service. The Adoption Service achieved 'good' for the quality of care and support provided, and 'good' for quality of management and leadership. The Fostering Service achieved the same score in each category, as did Children's Residential Services (Grodians).

Islesburgh Out of School Care Service achieved a **grade of 'Very Good' for all four areas assessed** – quality of care and support, quality of environment, quality of staffing, and quality of management and leadership.

Policy and Resources Committee:

Achievements also included:

 The UK Government Full Fibre Challenge Fund bid for fibre network to North Isles is currently being considered by the Dept for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS). Good progress has been made with the bid with a recent visit from DCMS, who are expressing a strong interest in the project.
