	gathered in 2023. There are seven localities. Two of these localities are island groups: "Yell, Unst and Fetlar" and "Whalsay and Skerries". There is demographic and socioeconomic data available for the groups of combined islands. Locality profiles are available on the Shetland Partnership website.  Shetland Partnership's Locality Plan – Shetland's Islands with Small Populations, contains data on Fair Isle, Foula, Papa Stour, Fetlar and Skerries. There is data on: median income; cost of living; population; number of school children; challenges faced; and priorities for the future.
